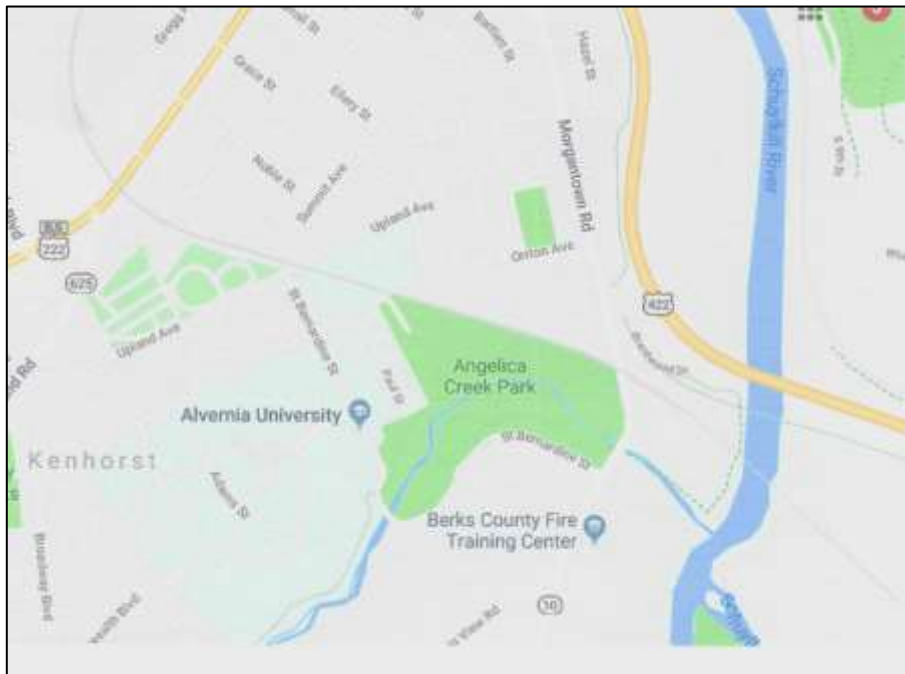


DIRECTIONS

Angelica Creek Park is located just south of Reading, PA. From the PA Turnpike I-76, take the Morgantown Exit for I-176. Go north on I-176 for 7.5 miles to Exit 7 for PA-10 toward Green Hills. Turn left on PA-10N/Morgantown Rd. Go 4.5 miles to St. Bernardine St. and turn left. Then it's a slight right to enter the parking lot for Angelica Creek Park. LBW road signs will be positioned along the route.

Distance: 10K/5K **AVA Trail Rating:** 1B
Trail: Walk is on scenic trails through Angelica Creek Park that extend along Angelica Creek providing access to flowering meadows, wetlands and the Schuylkill River Trail system. It also goes through surrounding residential areas and passes through the campus of Alvernia University. Surface ranges from asphalt to crushed stone to dirt. There are a few rolling hills but none significant. Not difficult for strollers and wheelchairs.

BIKE EVENT – AT 18/111111

Distance: 25K **AVA Trail Rating:** 1B
Trail: Bike along a section of the Schuylkill River Trail known as the Thun Trail. The trail has easy access from Angelica Creek Park. The surface is packed cinders. There are a few minor hills. Enjoy impressive views of the Schuylkill River and surrounding hills.

AWARD: Both events are **IVV Credit Only**.

FEES: **IVV Credit = \$3.00.** These events are **Free** for those who want to participate without receiving IVV Credit.

SPECIAL PROGRAMS: **Walk Event** qualifies for Boardwalks, Bridges, Take a Walk in a City Park, You'll Never Walk Alone, and PA County Program. **Bike Event** qualifies for Bridges and PA County Program.

PARKING: Parking is free at The Nature Place.

FACILITIES: Restrooms are available at the Start/Finish only. Water will also be available at the Start/Finish.

ELIGIBILITY: This event is open to the public. You do not need to be a member of the Liberty Bell Wanderers to participate. Adult supervision is required for all children.

PROCEDURES: All participants must register and complete a Start Card which is carried on the walk, and must be returned at the Finish. This also applies to free walkers.

CONDITIONS: This event will be held regardless of weather conditions. There are no refunds. **Pets are permitted but must be leashed and picked up after.**

DISCLAIMER: The American Volkssport Association or its subsidiary clubs are not responsible for theft or loss of personal belongings or property. All participants must sign a waiver.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION: Angelical Creek Park represents a natural outdoor classroom and recreational park, and is home to The Nature Place, an education center which opened in 2017.
